PERMISSION FOR ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

The form allows students to grant third parties, including parents, access to their educational records maintained by the student's university. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Buckley Amendment) prohibits access to, or release of, educational records or personally identifiable information contained in such records (other than directory information) without the written consent of the student, with certain regulatory exceptions. A description of a student's rights under FERPA is set fourth in more detail in the university catalog.
