### Undergraduate Transfer-Out Rate

As reported in the most recent 2018-19 Graduation Rates IPEDS Report, 39% of the first-time, full-time freshmen cohort entering in the fall 2012 semester transferred out of the University after six years.

### Undergraduate Employment

Exit interviews conducted with undergraduates who had their degrees conferred in May 2019 indicated that 91% were employed. Of those employed, 70% reported being employed in their field or related field of study. In addition, 50% reported plans to continue with their education.
